## **LISZT BICENTENARY RECITAL**

introduces and plays masterpieces by LISZT in this special anniversary celebration of the composer's life and work. We hear the brilliant *Jeux d'eaux à la Villa d'Este* and the virtuoso operatic paraphrase, *Réminiscences de Don Juan*. The programme also includes major works by CHOPIN – *Sonata No. 2 in B flat*, *Twelve Etudes op. 25*, and *Berceuse op. 57*. STUART DAVIES won the Trinity College of Music Scholars Competition with his performance of Ravel's *Concerto for the Left Hand*. He has given recitals at many venues including Steinway Hall, the Fitzwilliam Museum, Cambridge, the Pump Room at Bath, and performed the Rachmaninov *Fourth Piano Concerto* with the Cambridge Camerata. Later this month, he will be performing the Brahms *Piano Concerto in B flat* with the same orchestra. He travels regularly to Poland and Serbia and recently won the Chopin Competition at Antonin in Poland.

**THE TAMING OF THE SHREW**

Pretending to find her courteous and gentle, Petruchio ignores her rudeness and rebuffs. Thus the taming of this shrewish young lady begins. He keeps her waiting at her wedding, turns up dressed like a scarecrow, and after this fiasco, takes her home and, through a series of tricks, finally tames her. Other characters have varying courtships by contrast, but 'all's well that ends well' when Petruchio emerges triumphant. HEARTBREAK PRODUCTIONS make a welcome return to St. Mary's and celebrate their 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary year with this riotous Shakespeare comedy.

The Queen's Six were established in 2008 during the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the accession of Queen Elizabeth I and it is from her that they take their name. She was a great patron of the arts and it was widely known that she often engaged the services of musicians to write and perform for her. The notable 'six' from this era were Thomas Tallis, William Byrd, Thomas Tompkins, Thomas Morley, Orlando Gibbons and John Dowland. The 21<sup>st</sup> century equivalent of those fine musicians is today based inside Windsor Castle. The Queen's Six are six professional male singers who sing full time at St. George's Chapel, and whose homes are within the castle walls. This rare privilege demands the highest musical standards. They sing regularly for the Royal family at both private and state occasions in the Royal Chapel. There is something to suit all tastes, from Byrd to Bach and Bach to The Beatles.

**THE REINECKE ENSEMBLE**

The programme includes works by romantic composers, beginning with Schumann's *Marchenerzählungen* for clarinet, viola and piano. We hear Clara Schumann's *March* and *Nocturne*, *Phantasiestücke* by Neils Gade, *Two Hungarian Dances* by Brahms and *Three Pieces* by Max Bruch. The Trio takes its name from Carl Reinecke (1824-1910), whose melodious and masterly trio is included in the second half of this evening's recital. Among Reinecke's distinguished pupils were Albeniz and Janacek. Svendsen and Grieg. STEPHEN PIERCE has played with most of the major orchestras including the CBSO under Sir Simon Rattle and the LSO under André Previn, is a member of the National Symphony Orchestra and has recorded for Virgin Records. CHRISTOPHER WELLINGTON was the first ever Principal Viola of the National Youth Orchestra, was Principal Viola with the Philharmonia Orchestra, and was a member of the Rasumovsky String Quartet. TERENCE ALLBRIGHT is pianist in *The Singer's Ensemble*, has accompanied some of the world's most famous singers, including Dame Felicity Lott, Jane Manning OBE, Ann Murray DBE and Philip Langridge CBE. He gave a first performance of his own compositions at the Brighton Festival in 2009 and has recorded a new CD of Peter Thorogood's *Piano Suites*.

**LORDS OF BRAMBER**

**JOHN AND JEANNETTE SIMPSON**

The year is 1076. The building of Bramber Castle has just been completed. In PART ONE, the new governor, the powerful William de Braose and his family are now in residence. You are one of a number of privileged visitors invited to tour the great rooms and battlements. JOHN (who can trace his own ancestry back to William de Braose himself) and JEANNETTE, in their ingenious audio-visual presentation, bring that visit to life. They uncover before our very eyes the secrets of the past buried in the ruins of our Norman castles and unravel the mysteries that lie beneath the stones. Highly respected for their years of research, John and Jeannette's 'presentation' is a fascinating window through which we can watch our history unfold. We even hear the cock crowing at dawn, the wind whistling through the rafters. PART TWO concerns the tragic story of William's son, Philip de Braose, whose wife, the Lady Aanor, subsequently gave to the Knights Templar in his memory five acres of land in Bramber on which St. Mary's would one day be built. **Not to be missed!!**

**JAZZ TRIO**

Originally a classical prodigy at the age of four, later studying with Badura-Skoda in Vienna, JOHN LAW turned to jazz in 1986 and has toured widely throughout Europe, Russia and Canada. He appeared with great acclaim at the Niekelsdorf Festival in Austria in 1993. He is widely recognised as one of Europe's most creative jazz pianists and is a brilliantly inventive and prolific composer. YURI GOLOUBEV is one of the most highly-regarded Russian bass players in the world today. ASAF SIRKIS, from Israel, is a percussionist of great originality, who can move with great ease from straight jazz to freely improvised sounds and poly-rhythms. JOHN LAW has performed in

over 50 festivals and has recorded over 20 CDs, some of which will be available for purchase during the interval.
